

SHRUBS-1

ACER palmatum 'Emperor', syn. 'Wolff' (Japanese Maple)

Attractive foliage with dark red coloring in summer turns brilliant scarlet in fall. Blackish-red bark. Leaf buds open later in the spring, avoiding danger of late frosts allowing this small tree to thrive in colder climates. For filtered sun. Grows to 15' tall and wide. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Monrovia

ARBORVITAE: See Thuja

ARONIA arbutifolia 'Brilliantissima' (Brilliant Red Chokeberry)

White flowers in May. Brilliant 1/4" red berries in the fall are retained for a long period of time. Does well in moist or well-drained soil. Excellent in mass plantings or borders. Height: 6-12'. Spread: 5-8". Upright and mounded form. Foliage is dark green. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

AZALEA: See Rhododendron

BERBERIS x 'Golden Carousel' (Hybrid Barberry)

This introduction from Bailey's is a hybrid of Korean and Japanese barberry, combining the best of both. The golden yellow leaves on this upright grower take on a nice fall color with some red and orange tones. Best planted in an area with light afternoon shade to prevent scorching. Height: 4-5'. Spread: 3-4'. Foliage is yellow, fading to green. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

BERBERIS thunbergii 'Burgundy Carousel' (Japanese Red Barberry)

Burgundy-purple summer and fall foliage on spreading, slightly arching shrubs. An excellent accent, hedge or thorny barrier. Ht.: 3'. Spread: 4-5'. Prefers moist, but well-drained soil. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

BERBERIS thunbergii 'Rose Glow' (Red Barberry)

Attractive variegated foliage, yellow flowers and red fruit. Foliage is a rose-red maturing to deep maroon, turning red in fall. Compact, rounded habit. Ht.: 3'. Spread: 2-3'. Place in full sun for best color. An attractive specimen plant and can be used to create an interesting colored hedge. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

BUDDLEIA davidii 'Black Knight' (Butterfly Bush)

Lance-shaped, pointed mid-green to gray green foliage; dark purple-blue flowers July-October. Ht.: 60+". Spread: 4'. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Needs good winter protection in Wisconsin. Use in the border garden, cutflower, containers, nectarous plant, butterfly magnet. Zone 5. 4 1/2" Black Pot.

BUDDLEIA davidii 'English Butterfly Series' (Butterfly Bush)

A new series of compact, well-behaved and bushy buddleia--roughly 1/3 the size of typical davidii cultivars at only 36-48". Blooms late summer. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Needs good winter protection in Wisconsin. Use in the border garden,

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cutflower, containers, nectarous plant, butterfly magnet. Excellent both in beds and large containers. Zone 5. Proven Winners Shrub.

Adonis Blue--Deep purple-blue.

BUDDLEIA davidii 'Pink Delight' (Butterfly Bush)

Lance-shaped, pointed mid-green to gray green foliage; pinkish purple flowers July-October. Ht.: 60+". Spread: 4'. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Needs good winter protection in Wisconsin. Use in the border garden, cutflower, containers, nectarous plant, butterfly magnet. Zone 5. 4 1/2" Black Pot.

BURNING BUSH: See *Euonymus*

BUTTERFLY BUSH: See *Buddleia*

CARYOPTERIS x clandonensis 'Blue Mist' (Blue Mist Shrub, Bluebeard)

Woody shrub with a dense mounding habit; aromatic, blue-green, lance-shaped foliage; fluffy, powder blue flowers in July-Sept. Ht.: 24-30". Spread: 16-20". Plant in average, well-drained soil in full sun. Use in perennial borders or as a low hedge. A bee and butterfly magnet. Prune hard in early spring. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

CARYOPTERIS incana 'Sunshine Blue' (Blue Mist Shrub, Bluebeard)

A marked improvement over 'Worcester Gold', the fragrant foliage is a sunny yellow with deep amethyst-blue flowers from July-Sept. Provides great late season blooms. Though Zone 5 hardy, dieback is likely and should be treated as a perennial, cutting it back in the spring. Plant in average, well-drained soil in full sun. A bee and butterfly magnet. Ht.: 3'. Proven Winners Shrub.

CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa 'Pygmaea Aurescens' (Hinoki Cypress)

Evergreen shrub with spreading branches that hold flat, fan-shaped branchlets of yellow-bronze in spring, green in summer, coppery-bronze in winter. Full sun. Slow-growing mound to 2' high and 5' wide. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera 'Baby Blue' (Sawara Cypress)

Low-maintenance, slow-growing accent plant for hedge, foundation or containers. Silvery-blue foliage is fine textured and forms a dense shrub. Attractive combined with other green or yellow conifers. Height: 6'. Spread: 4'. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera 'Golden Charm' (Thread-Branch Cypress)

Compact, erect, cone-shaped shrub with golden-yellow new foliage. Excellent mop-headed accent plant that makes a nice background border or small hedge. Full sun. A very slow grower to 5-6' and 7-8' wide. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

CINQUEFOIL: See *Potentilla*

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CLETHRA alnifolia 'Ruby Spice' (Summersweet)

A rather new cultivar selected for vastly improved bright pink blooms that do not fade to white. Blooms in midsummer and has a beautiful golden fall color. Clethra is rather shade tolerant, but will also withstand full sun. This is a sport of 'Pink Spires'. Grows upright to 3-6' and spreads to 3-4'. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

CLETHRA alnifolia 'Sixteen Candles' (Summersweet)

A dense rounded shrub with glossy, dark green leaves. Noted for its erect, candle-like flower spikes. The creamy-white blooms are 6" long and extremely fragrant when they bloom in mid-summer. Prefers part-shade and moist soil. Height: 4-5'. Spread: 2-3'. Fall foliage is yellow. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

CHOKEBERRY: See Aronia

CORNUS alba 'Ivory Halo' (Redtwig Dogwood)

A Bailey's introduction, this compact selection of variegated dogwood provides beautiful variegated foliage in summer and attractive red twigs in winter. Its finer textured, fuller, more compact form lends itself to smaller planting areas. 5-6' high and wide. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

CORNUS sericea 'Alleman's Compact' (Red Osier Dogwood)

Similar to red osier, but with deeper, wine-red stem color and a more compact form. A four season beauty with white blossoms in May, pleasant green foliage in summer, giving way to bright red berries in fall and finally outstanding winter twig color. A good plant to attract wildlife to the yard. 4-5' high and wide. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

COTINUS coggygria 'Nordine' (Smokebush, Venetian Sumac)

Flowers are showy in large, ruby-red, plumose clusters in mid-summer. This is the hardiest of the purple-leaf smokebushes, but dies back to the crown during severe winters. Height and width: 8-10'. Fall foliage is brilliant yellow to orange. Zone 5 or hardier. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

COTONEASTER horizontalis 'Perpusillus' (Rockspray)

Great for rock gardens and banks. Brilliant fall color to foliage and red berries on this excellent, spreading groundcover with thick, intertwining branches. Semi-evergreen. Full sun to part-shade. Fast grower to 1-2' tall and up to 7' wide. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

CRANBERRYBUSH: See Viburnum

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DEUTZIA gracilis 'Chardonney Pearls' (Slender Deutzia)

Attractive, crisp, lime-yellow foliage provides season long garden color long after the pure white, pearl-like buds explode into a shower of fragrant springtime flowers. Perfect in the perennial garden or shrub border. Also excellent in containers. 20-36" tall. Grow in part shade. Zone 5. Proven Winners Shrub.

DIERVILLA lonicera (Dwarf Bush Honeysuckle)

This native to the northern United States and Canada is not the invasive species overtaking our woodlands. This super hardy selection has small yellow flowers in late spring and early summer. Does very well in sandy and dry soils. Habit is mounded and spreading with bronze-green foliage that turns a lovely red in fall. Excellent in mass plantings. Ht.: 4'. Spread: 3-4'. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

DOGWOOD: See Cornus

ELDERBERRY: See Sambucus

EUONYMUS alatus (Dwarf Burning Bush)

Dwarf, bushy and compact form with corky bark. Excellent for hedges with brilliant red fall color. 5-6' tall and wide. Summer foliage is medium green. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

EUONYMUS fortunei 'Gold Splash' (Upright Wintercreeper)

Extra large leaves with golden margins. The attractive orange and yellow fruits are very showy and persistent. Very hardy and disease resistant. For sun to shade. Grows to 18-24" tall with an upright habit, unlike the species. Zone 5. Proven Winners Shrub.

FOTHERGILLA major 'Mount Airy'

Noted for its fall color, ranging from yellow through orange and red. Blooms heavily, with white, fragrant flower spikes in April to early May before the leaves appear. Blooms last for up to a month! Summer foliage is a dark, blue-green above and whitish beneath. Ht.: 5-6'. Spread: 4-5' with an upright habit. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HAMAMELIS virginiana (Common Witch Hazel)

Flowers have fragrant, yellow, ribbon-like petals, 1 1/2" in diameter and bloom in late fall about the time the leaves drop. Does well in a woodland setting in naturalized situations. In full sun and good soil will develop into a well-rounded vase-shaped plant. Native to the Eastern U.S. Height: 15'. Spread: 12-15'. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HIBISCUS syriacus x Satin Series in rose (Rose of Sharon)

Hibiscus syriacus does not die back to the ground each year! Prune out only dead wood or prune to shape only after flowering. This series has large, single flowers. Easy

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to grow. Ht.: 8-12' Blooms mid-summer. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Zone 5. Proven Winners Shrub.

HIBISCUS syriacus x Chiffon Series in lavender and white (Rose of Sharon)
Breathtaking! Large, single flowers adorned with a lacy center to create an anemone-like bloom. H. syriacus does not die back to the ground each year! Prune out only dead wood or prune to shape only after flowering. Easy to grow. Ht.: 8-12' Blooms mid-summer. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Zone 5. Proven Winners Shrub.

HYDRANGEA arborescens 'Annabelle' (Smooth Hydrangea)
Huge white flowers held upright on sturdier stems than the species. This is the impressive white hydrangea one sees as a foundation planting across the country. Habit is low and mounding, growing to 4-5' tall and 5' wide. Tolerates fairly dense shade. Foliage is dark green and not bothered by Japanese beetles. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA macrophylla 'Endless Summer-the Original' (Bigleaf, Hortensia, Mophead Hydrangea)
A super-hardy, everblooming mophead! Developed in Minnesota, this variety has serrated, leathery, deep green foliage that turns bronze in the fall. Huge pink (blue in acidic soils by adding aluminum sulfate) blooms appear on both old and new wood for continuous bloom. Deadheading encourages repeat bloom. Grows to just 3-5' tall and wide so it fits perfectly into the perennial bed. For full sun to part shade. Zone 4. Priced as marked from both Bailey's and Monrovia.

HYDRANGEA macrophylla 'Endless Summer-Blushing Bride' (Bigleaf, Hortensia, Mophead Hydrangea)
A super-hardy, everblooming mophead! Developed in Minnesota, this variety has serrated, leathery, deep green foliage that turns bronze in the fall. Huge pure white blooms mature with a pink blush and appear on both old and new wood for continuous bloom. Deadheading encourages repeat bloom. Grows to just 3-5' tall and wide so it fits perfectly into the perennial bed. For full sun to part shade. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA macrophylla 'Twist-n-Shout' (Lacecap Hydrangea)
An absolutely extraordinary reblooming lacecap from the Endless Summer collection. Lacy deep-pink centers are surrounded by gorgeous blossoms of pink or periwinkle blue on both old and new wood all summer long, depending on the soil type. Sturdy red stems and glossy, deep green foliage turn red-burgundy in fall. Easy to care for and Zone 4 hardy. Compact enough for containers at just 3-4' tall and wide. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA macrophylla 'First Editions Light-O-Day' (Lacecap Hydrangea)

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This is an elegant lacecap with remarkable wide, pure white variegation. The outer ring of the flowers are bright white and the delicate inner blooms are either pink or blue depending on soil pH. Very floriferous! Very eye-catching! Ht.: 3-5'. Spread: 3-5'. For full sun to part shade. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA macrophylla 'Nikko Blue' (Bigleaf, Hortensia, Mophead Hydrangea)
A vigorous mophead and the most popular of the large-flowered blue hydrangeas. May be pink in soil that is too alkaline. Huge, rounded flowers in late spring to early summer. Grows to 6', but usually stays smaller in northern climates. Grow in full sun to part shade. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

HYDRANGEA paniculata 'Angel's Blush'
Long-lasting, 10" long white flower clusters turn rosy-red in late summer and fall as they age, adding color to the garden when few plants are in bloom. Best used as an accent specimen for part sun. Fast growing to 8-10' tall and 6-10' wide. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

HYDRANGEA paniculata 'Limelight'
Continuous blooming lime-green flowers are held on upright strong stems. An incredible combination of green, pink and burgundy blooms in autumn. Ht.: 6-8'. Spread: to 10'.
Plant in full sun in any good garden soil. Great for cutting. Zone 3. Proven Winners Shrub.

HYDRANGEA paniculata 'Pinky Winky'
Showy bicolor flowers of white and deep pink are up to 16" long. Blooms from summer until frost in all climates. Ht.: 6-8'. Spread: 6-8'. Plant in full sun in any good garden soil. Great for cutting. Zone 4. Proven Winners Shrub.

HYDRANGEA paniculata 'Quick Fire'
Blooms a month earlier than all other varieties! As the summer progresses, blooms turn a vivid deep pink. A very hardy shrub that blooms reliably. Blooms from early summer until frost in all climates. Ht.: 6-8'. Spread: 6-8'. Plant in full sun in any good garden soil. Great for cutting. Zone 3. Proven Winners Shrub.

JUNIPERUS x pfitzeriana 'Gold Coast Improved'
Though not a blooming shrub, this juniper's lovely foliage and compact habit makes this a nicely textured addition to the mixed perennial bed. Forms a flat-topped bush with tiered foliage. Deep chrome-yellow leaves hold their color into the winter. For full sun. Ht.: 4'. Spread: 3'. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

JUNIPERUS chinensis 'Daub's Frosted' (Chinese Juniper)

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Unusually low growing pfitzer for groundcover applications. Tops of blue-green foliage are frosted with gold creating a two-tone effect. Attractive around rock outcroppings. Full sun. Fast growth to 15" tall and 5' wide. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

JUNIPERUS horizontalis 'Icee Blue' (Creeping Juniper)

Prostrate, creeping shrub with blue-green foliage. This North American native seldom grows taller than 12-18". A fantastic addition to the front of the mixed border or large containers. Spread can reach 8-12'. For full sun. Zone 3. Price as marked from Monrovia.

JUNIPERUS scopulorum 'Table Top Blue' (Rocky Mountain Juniper)

Neat, flat-topped shrub makes excellent barrier or informal hedge. Showy, dense, rich silvery-blue foliage highlights this very durable performer. Tolerates both heat and drought. Full sun. 5' tall and 7-12' wide. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

JUNIPERUS squamata 'Blue Star' (Singleseed Juniper)

Attractive sparkling foliage on dense, spreading, mounding branches. Creates a colorful contrast. Use in the rock garden or as a low border plant. Full sun. A slow grower to 2-3' high, spreads 3-4' wide. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

KOLKWITZIA amabilis 'Dream Catcher' (Beautybush)

Tremendous display of flowers and chartreuse-colored foliage tipped with bronze produce golden-orange autumn color. Adds year round interest to the garden. Tolerates poor soil. Ht.: 6-9' with an upright growth habit. For part shade. Zone 4. Proven Winners Shrub.

PHILADELPHUS 'Miniature Snowflake' (Dwarf Mockorange)

This compact, prolific bloomer is known for its dwarf habit and excellent flowering. The double white flowers are extremely fragrant. Height: 2-3'. Spread: 1-2' with a dwarf, upright habit. The foliage is deep green and very disease resistant. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

PHYSOCARPUS opulifolius 'Coppertina' (Ninebark)

An exciting new and improved ninebark with neat, compact branching and fine, deeply cut, coppery-orange leaves that transform to rich red in the fall. Pinkish-white, button-like flowers appear in mid-summer. Showy and extremely hardy. A wonderful cutflower. Ht.: 6-8'. Spread: 5'. Grow in any good garden soil in full sun. Native to North America. Zone 3. Proven Winners Shrub.

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PHYSOCARPUS opulifolius 'Summer Wine' (Ninebark)

An exciting new and improved ninebark with neat, compact branching and fine, deeply cut, dark crimson-red leaves. Pinkish-white, button-like flowers appear in mid-summer. Showy and extremely hardy. A wonderful cutflower. Ht.: 5-6'. Spread: 5'. Grow in any good garden soil in full sun. Native to North America. Zone 3. Proven Winners Shrub.

PICEA abies 'Little Gem' (Dwarf Norway Spruce)

A true dwarf, forming a tight dome of short branchlets, with soft, light green needles. Can be grown as an accent plant in the border, alpine gardens or as a patio plant in containers. Extremely slow grower, forming a compact head 18" in diameter. Zone 2. For full sun. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

PICEA abies 'Nidiformis' (Nest Spruce)

A beautiful, dwarf spruce, broad, dense and slow growing. Light green foliage on spreading branches rises slightly up with nodding tips. A distinctive plant for rock gardens or specimen use. Hardy, best in full sun or minimal shade. 3' tall and 2-3' wide here in the north. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

PICEA glauca 'Blue Wonder' (Dwarf Alberta Spruce)

Improved selection with striking gray-blue foliage. Outstanding in containers or planted in the landscape in groupings or as a single specimen. Full to partial sun. Slow growing to a dense cone 6' tall and 2 1/2' wide. Zone 2. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

PINUS mugo pumilio (Dwarf Mugo Pine)

Dwarf, bright green color in all seasons. Attractive mounded shape that can be maintained by pruning. Especially nice in early summer when new candles of growth appear. Very rugged and hardy. Nice in containers or in the landscape. Full sun. Zone 2. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

POTENTILLA 'Arc En Ciel' (Hybrid Cinquefoil)

A new groundcover for shade is hot stuff! Striking rose-like double flowers are bronzed and rebloom continuously from June until fall. Dynamic color stands out against rich green foliage. Prefers a well-drained location. Part shade. Rapid growth to 1' tall and wide, spreading in time. Nice in the perennial border. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

POTENTILLA fruticosa 'Goldfinger' (Cinquefoil)

Showy golden flowers up to 1 1/2" in diameter, bloom all summer. Compact habit and showy display make this an outstanding potentilla. Height: 3'. Spread: 3-4' with a mounded habit. Foliage is coarse and dark green. Full sun. Zone 2. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

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POTENTILLA fruticosa 'Pink Beauty' (Cinquefoil)

This floriferous introduction from the University of Manitoba has clear pink semi-double flowers and bright green foliage that is bushy and full. The flower color holds up very well, but will fade when the nights are very warm. The rounded shape is 2' tall and wide. Full sun. Zone 2. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

POTENTILLA fruticosa 'Red Ace' (Cinquefoil)

Showy shrub with rich vermilion flowers with undersides of pale yellow in summer. Flowers change from red to yellow under intense heat. Densely branched form is useful as a colorful accent in the border. Full sun. Moderate grower to 2-3' tall and 3-4' wide. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

POTENTILLA fruticosa 'Mango Tango' (Cinquefoil)

This exciting potentilla from the University of Manitoba has striking bicolor flowers that display shades of orange and red radiating from the center of the flower petal over a base color of deep yellow. The red intensifies in cool weather. Hot weather softens the color. Forms a tidy mound and is best in full sun. Wonderful in the mixed perennial border. Ht.: 2'. Spread: 2'. The foliage is a bright green. Zone 2. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

RHAMNUS frangula 'Fine Line' (Hybrid Buckthorn)

An unusual narrow, upright shrub with lacy, fern-like foliage. Uses for this new shrub are endless. Create narrow hedges or screens, or use as an accent plant in a patio container. This environmentally friendly variety does not become weedy like the species. Developed at the Scenic View Nursery in Green Bay. Ht.: 5-7'. Grow in any good garden soil in full to part sun. Zone 2. Proven Winners Shrub.

RHODODENDRON 'Lights' Azalea Hybrids

Developed at the University of Minnesota for their extreme hardiness (Zone 4), the 'Lights' Series is considered the best rhododendron for Wisconsin gardens. Grow in moist, but well-drained, rich, acidic (pH 4.5-5.5) soil in dappled shade. Azaleas can tolerate neither too much sun, nor dense shade. Though extremely hardy, the 'Lights' Series should still be protected from bitter winter winds. Late frosts will kill flower buds so they may not bloom some years. Roots are very shallow so never plant too deep. And because they are shallow rooted, a loose mulch is advised to preserve moisture, as azaleas are not very drought tolerant. We are carrying the following: (All are priced as marked)

Candy Lights--3-4' tall with lavender-pink flowers. From Bailey's.

Golden Lights--6-8' tall with golden-yellow single blooms. From Monrovia.

Mandarin Lights--Brilliant orange blooms on 4-5' tall plants. From Monrovia.

Northern Lights--Most popular of the 'Lights'. Deep pink. 4-5' tall. From Bailey's.

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Rosy Lights--4-5' tall and spreading. Flowers are a dark rose-pink. From Bailey's.

RHODODENDRON 'Cannon's Double' Exbury Hybrid Azalea

Double, pinky, yellow blooms with orange flare. Upright habit bears dense red-tinted foliage that grows bright at season's end. Grow in moist, but well-drained, rich, acidic (pH 4.5-5.5) soil in dappled shade. Azaleas can tolerate neither too much sun, nor dense shade. Though extremely hardy, should still be protected from bitter winter winds. Late frosts will kill flower buds so they may not bloom some years. Roots are very shallow so never plant too deep. And because they are shallow rooted, a loose mulch is advised to preserve moisture, as azaleas are not very drought tolerant. 5-6' tall and wide. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Monrovia.

RHUS typhina 'Tiger Eyes' (Cutleaf Staghorn Sumac)

This hot, new sumac is stunning in the mixed or prairie border or as a backdrop for all garden beds. Interest is four season! 'Tiger Eyes' is a gorgeous, golden-leafed selection. New growth is chartreuse, quickly changing to yellow, both colors contrasting nicely with the rosy-pink stems. Branches angle upward, while the deeply cut leaflets drape downward, giving it a rather oriental look. Foliage turns a dramatic yellow, orange and intense red in the fall. Grow this native American plant in full sun in any garden soil. Grows to 6' with a 6' spread. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

ROSA (Garden Roses)

The rose is far and away the garden's most beloved shrub, known for its beautiful blooms and astounding fragrance. No other shrub compares in versatility or color selection. Form ranges from shrubs to climbers to groundcovers. Many varieties have been in cultivation for centuries. There are forms native to nearly all parts of the world. Most have thorns and produce fruits in the fall known as "hips", a winter staple for animals and humans alike. Roses can be planted en masse, used as a hedge, incorporated into the perennial border or even used in containers. Roses are divided into categories based primarily on culture and plant and/or flower form. Klein's grows only potted roses grown from root stock we receive in late winter. Most roses are grafted on to hardy root stock to improve winter survival. Once home, plant your roses at about the same level you find them in our pots. If planting bare root stock, plant the graft at or just slightly below the soil line. Roses are susceptible to a number of diseases and insect pests--especially fungi and Japanese beetles. When shopping for roses, choose one that is best for the desired situation. Hybrid teas are generally Zone 5 hardy (we sell only hardy roses), but far hardier shrub roses are available. To prep for winter, simply mound soil over the graft and wrap in fabric stuffed with hay. Remove all leaves that have dropped to the ground. We do not advise the use of "rose cones" because they can easily "cook" budded plants in the late winter/early spring sun and can harbor both insect and fungal problems. In early April, remove the fabric and the mounded soil. Prune out any obviously dead or diseased branches, making sure not to cut into healthy tissue. Roses are from Jackson & Perkins unless otherwise noted.

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NOTE: AARS Winner denotes an All-America Rose Selection. Roses in the AARS trials are tested in 24 official test gardens throughout the United States, representing a wide range of climates and growing conditions. They undergo two years of evaluation by rose professionals, and are graded for vigor, growth habit, disease resistance, foliage, flower production, bud and flower form, opening and finishing color, fragrance, stem quality and overall appeal.

HYBRID TEA AND GRANDIFLORA ROSES:

The hybrid teas and grandifloras are the most popular classes of roses. They are tall, stately plants with large blooms of refined form. Most carry their flowers as singles on long stems suitable for cutting. In the landscape, they are often used as single specimens, or as the featured plants in mixed beds of roses. Most are extremely fragrant.

APRIL IN PARIS: 2008 Rose of the Year. Classic seashell buds open into blooms of the palest dawn pink edged in a soft pink. Very long-lasting in the vase. Has an intense tea rose fragrance. Ht.: 5'. Foliage is a glossy, dark green.

AROMATHERAPY: Perfect pink buds and blossoms sweeten the air with a powerful aroma--and an upright, well-branched bush produces them in great numbers. Extremely long-lasting in bouquets. Ht.: 5 1/2'. Semi-glossy, dark-green foliage. Fragrance is strong and fruity.

BELLA'ROMA: 2003 Rose of the Year. Boasts sumptuous blooms and a strong, tantalizing perfume. Its bright yellow buds open to reveal gorgeous, warm yellow petals blushed pink at the edges. Ht.: 4 1/2'. The foliage is glossy and dark green.

BLUE GIRL: Large, double blooms are an extraordinary lavender-lilac color. Light fruity fragrance. Very compact at just 2-3' tall. From Bailey's

CHRYSLER IMPERIAL: From 1953. This classic has maroon buds, opening to brilliant red blooms. Grows to 3'. Very high petal count. Semi-glossy, dark green foliage. Fragrance is a strong damask.

DIANA, PRINCESS OF WALES: New in 2000. A classic hybrid tea of outstanding character and flower form, and the most sought after rose on the market today. Ivory petals overlaid with a clear pink blush reflecting the Princess' warmth and radiance. The open flowers are generously perfumed with a sweet fragrance. Flowers measure 4 1/2-5 inches on 5 1/2' plants.

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DOUBLE DELIGHT: Its fresh scent is fragrant up to 10' away! Scarlet buds open to a creamy whitewashed pink, ending in buttery yellow and strawberry red. Only 3-4' tall. Fragrance is strong and spicy.

FRAGRANT CLOUD: The Rose of the Year Winner in 1968. Known for perfume so luxurious that a single flower can scent a whole room! Clusters of vibrant high-centered coral-red blossoms cover the plant throughout the summer. Plants grow to 3-4' and blossoms measure up to 5" across. Foliage is dark green.

HEIRLOOM: From 1972. Richly fragrant blooms borne singly and in clusters. Magenta buds lighten to lilac as the flowers open. Sweet rose scent. Foliage is dark green. Grows to 3'.

INGRID BERGMAN: Luscious, dark red, double blooms with a velvety texture. This classic favorite holds up to summer heat, blooming until first frost. 3-4' tall. Sweet fragrance.

KISS ME: A very fragrant rose from the Easy Elegance Collection. Bears clusters of large, double, clear pink blooms, reminiscent of English roses. It flowers all season and is especially attractive in the perennial border. Highly disease resistant foliage adds to its appeal as a cut flower. 2-3' tall. From Bailey's.

LADY BIRD: Lady Bird Johnson chose this elegant new rose for its energetic color and tantalizing fragrance. A large-flowered coral orange hybrid tea with a striking warm bloom color, great vase life and long stems. Tall at 5-6' with glossy dark green foliage. The fragrance is light and spicy.

MELODY PARFUMEE: Delicious old-rose fragrance and wonderful color! Deep plum buds open a rich lavender, then soften to a delicate silvery shade, and their fragrance is a sweet, spice-edged scent as seductive as French perfume. This is a spectacular rose in full flower, and as the blooms fade, their petals fall away cleanly to keep the plant looking fresh and tidy. Petal count is 30.

MIDAS TOUCH: A 1994 AARS Winner with abundant, clear, bright yellow blooms all summer long possessing aromas of musk and fruit. Blooms are large and double on 3-5' plants. From Bailey's.

OLYMPIAD: A 1984 AARS Winner. A superior garden performer produces an abundance of non-fading, brilliant red blooms with classic

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form on long stems. Very vigorous. Fragrance is light. Blooms measure 5" and have a petal count of 30-35. From Bailey's.

PERFUME DELIGHT: A 1974 AARS Winner. Double blooms in rose-pink with a wonderful damask fragrance. Leathery, dark green foliage sets the stage for a nonstop parade of flowers on 3 foot plants.

PURPLE PASSION: A grandiflora with deep-purple, high-centered blooms and an irresistible lemon fragrance. Vigorous bush produces countless strong stems all season long, crowned with superb cutting flowers. Grows to 5'.

RADIANT PERFUME: A grandiflora and one of the most fragrant yellow roses ever. A delicious, lemony scent is just one of its many charms. Add sparkling golden color, graceful form and long stems. New for 2005. 5' plants with glossy, dark green foliage.

RIO SAMBA: A classic!! A festival of hot yellow blooms edged in orange that are excellent for cutting. A single plant will set the landscape ablaze. Grows to 4' tall. Petal count is 25-30. Medium green foliage and has a light fresh fragrance.

STRIKE IT RICH: This award winning update of Sutter's Gold improves the 1950 AARS Winner for garden performance. Pink-swirled orange-gold blooms spiral open from classically long buds poised on reddish stems. Generous clusters of sunny flowers are redolent of sweet fruit and spice. Plants are vigorous at 5-6' tall and disease resistant. Fragrance is strong spicy and fruity.

SWEET FRAGRANCE: Hybrid tea-shaped buds in tropical tints of coral and orange with a deep yellow base swirl open to full sweetly fragrant, apricot blossoms. Each bloom matures to salmon-pink, adding interest with the range of color. Clusters of buds and blooms are held on sturdy canes making them perfect for cutting. A vigorous, upright grower at 2-4' tall with excellent disease resistance. Everblooming. From Bailey's

SWEETNESS: 2009 Rose of the Year. As its name implies, Sweetness is a delectable treat for the senses. Sweetness bursts with a soft, versatile lavender color and fills the garden with clusters of high-centered blooms all season. Packs an intoxicating sweet lemon fragrance. 5' tall with glossy, dark green foliage.

VETERAN'S HONOR: 2000 Rose of the Year. 10% of net sales benefit veterans' healthcare. Plump buds open into long-stemmed blossoms in a

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glorious shade of red that later softens to pastel pink overtones. Lasts up to two weeks in the vase! Plants grow to 5'. Fragrance is light raspberry on semi-glossy green foliage.

VOLUPTUOUS: 2005 Rose of the Year!! An undeniable head-turner, with exceptionally high-centered, fully-petaled, cupped blooms and satiny, deep fuchsia-pink petals. FLORIBUNDA ROSES:

Floribundas are primarily landscape roses. They are shorter than hybrid teas or grandifloras, and bloom more freely, setting blooms in clusters. Many varieties flower continuously spring through fall. Their low height makes them ideal for borders, or for lining walks or drives. They mix well in beds with hybrid teas, providing a lower front row of color against the taller plants.

BLACK CHERRY: The Floribunda of the Year Winner in 2006. One of the best red floribundas around. Dark crimson buds with black tips swirl open to a sumptuous cherry-red. Petals are edged in a chocolaty black. 3 1/2' tall. Each bloom measures 3-3 1/2" across. Fragrance is a light damask.

BLAZE (IMPROVED): One of the most popular climbing roses ever! A reliable, profuse bloomer that guarantees a colorful performance, cascading extravagantly from top to bottom with fiery red blossoms all season. Grows to 10-15'. Light, fruity fragrance.

BLAZE OF GLORY: With exceptional parentage, this blooming dynamo is a guaranteed garden success. Its novel orange color absolutely sizzles in the landscape. Grows to 12-14' with 4" blooms. Foliage is glossy and dark green and the scent is a light musk.

HENRY KELSEY: A very disease resistant limber climber with vivid red blooms and yellow stamens. The fragrance is rich and spicy. Forms lovely orange hips at season's end. Grows to 7'. From Bailey's.

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SCENT FROM ABOVE: Classic, high-centered flowers with an appealing, licorice perfume are set continuously throughout the season as this vigorous climber takes to the sky. Non-fading, yellow flowers cover a trellis or arbor. 8-10'.

SOCIAL CLIMBER: Such full-petaled, fragrant flowers are rare in a climber--it's the best available. Rapid, repeat bloom cycles and a well-branching habit yield an abundance of spicy-scented, deep-pink blossoms all season. 6' tall.

STAIRWAY TO HEAVEN: This robust rose grows fast and produces 4" red blooms. This is a reliable repeat bloomer. Canes are flexible enough for easy training. Hardy and deer-resistant. Grows to 10-12'.

HARDY SHRUB AND RUGOSA ROSES:

Hardy shrub roses have earned the name by being exceptionally tough; withstanding hard freezes, wind and drought. They have recurrent blooms throughout the season and are the most trouble free landscape roses available here in the north.

CAREFREE SPIRIT: A new low-growing shrub rose that exhibits even better disease resistance, habit and blooming power than its award-winning siblings. Huge clusters of deep, cherry red blooms and healthy dark green glossy foliage. Grows to 5' tall. Fragrance is slight.

CAREFREE WONDER: 1991 AARS Winner. A strong grower, covered with large, semi-double blooms borne in sprays, spring to fall. Bright pink petals have a creamy pink reverse. Plants are 4' wide and tall. Foliage is a semi-glossy, medium green. Fragrance is light and sweet.

CHAMPLAIN: An attractive shrub that grows on its own root stock to withstand winter dieback during our harsh winters. Has the bloom habit and form of a floribunda, setting bright red flowers that darken at the edges. Just 3' tall with 2 1/2" blooms. The fragrance is sweet. From Bailey's.

SPIREA x bumalda 'Goldflame' (Japanese Spirea)
