

SHRUBS (E-1)

NOTE: The following list of plants offered this spring season was compiled using plants already in stock, listed on acknowledgments or from orders placed but not yet received. Sometimes we don't receive ordered items or sometimes items are substituted by our vendors at their discretion. Other times we experience a crop failure for whatever reason. ACER ginnala 'Flame' (Amur Maple)

A large shrub or small tree selected for its beautiful red fall color and attractive clusters of seeds that persist, adding winter interest. 5-6' high and wide. Plant in full sun. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Green Value.

ACER palmatum 'Atropurpureum' (Japanese Maple)

Attractive foliage with dark red coloring in summer turns brilliant scarlet in fall. Blackish-red bark. Leaf buds open later in the spring, avoiding danger of late frosts allowing this small tree to thrive in colder climates. For filtered sun. Grows to 15' tall and wide. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Green Value.

AMELANCHIER alnifolia 'Regent' (Serviceberry)

A multi-stemmed shrub that displays multitudes of white flowers in spring and produces small black-purple fruits that are sweet; excellent for fresh eating or making jelly. Birds love them too. Since it flowers early in spring, this plant provides food for many pollinating insects. The gray-green foliage turns yellow to red in fall and is attractive to bees, butterflies and/or birds. Amelanchier 'Regent' grows into a small, mounded shrub 4 to 6-feet tall and wide. It is very winter hardy and has healthy foliage that is not bothered by insects or disease. It is drought tolerant but water regularly; do not overwater. Native Americans used Amelanchier fruit in making Pemmican, a staple of their diet. Priced as marked from Green Value.

ARONIA melanocarpa 'Autumn Magic' (Chokeberry)

Autumn Magic bears gorgeous white flower clusters in the spring, dark green foliage all summer, and dark blue-black fruits all winter. Grows to 5-7' tall. The fruit is a great source of vitamin C and high in antioxidants. Priced as marked from Green Value.

ARONIA melanocarpa elata (Chokeberry)

Large, flavorful blue-black fruits are high in vitamin C and delicious in jam and juices. Makes a beautiful blooming shrub in any flower garden. Grows to about 6'. Priced as marked from Green Value.

BERBERIS x 'Golden Carousel' (Hybrid Barberry)

This introduction from Bailey's is a hybrid of Korean and Japanese barberry, combining the best of both. The golden yellow leaves on this upright grower take on a nice fall color with some red and orange tones. Best planted in an area with light afternoon shade to prevent scorching. Height: 4-5'. Spread: 3-4'. Foliage is yellow, fading to green. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

BERBERIS thunbergii 'Rose Glow' (Red Barberry)

Attractive variegated foliage, yellow flowers and red fruit. Foliage is a rose-red maturing to deep maroon, turning red in fall. Compact, rounded habit. Ht.: 3'. Spread: 2-3'. Place in full sun for best color. An attractive specimen plant and can be used to create an interesting colored hedge. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

BERBERIS thunbergii 'Sunsation' (Red Barberry)

This golden-leaved barberry has a dense, rounded and compact form. Winter color is a contrasting dark brown, and spring brings new chartruese new growth on the dark stems. Grows to 3-4' tall and about 4' wide. Priced as marked from Green Value.

BETULA pendula 'Trost's Dwarf' (Dwarf Cutleaf Birch)

The leaves of this delightful new dwarf are so finely cut they remind one of a Japanese maple; grows to 3' very slowly. Plant Uses: butterfly plant; bonsai-suitable; deer resistant; rock gardens. Priced as marked from Green Value.

BUDDLEIA davidii 'Bicolor' (Butterfly Bush)

Lance-shaped, pointed mid-green to gray green foliage; bicolored lavender and yellow flowers July-October. Ht.: 60+". Spread: 4'. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Needs good winter protection in Wisconsin. Use in the border garden, cut flower, containers, nectarous plant, butterfly magnet. Zone 5. Two Gallon Pot.

BUDDLEIA davidii 'Black Knight' (Butterfly Bush)

Lance-shaped, pointed mid-green to gray green foliage; dark purple-blue flowers July-October. Ht.: 60+". Spread: 4'. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Needs good winter protection in Wisconsin. Use in the border garden, cut flower, containers, nectarous plant, butterfly magnet. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Green Value.

BUDDLEIA davidii 'Miss Ruby' (Butterfly Bush)

Lance-shaped, pointed mid-green to gray green foliage; vivid, rich pink flowers in July-October. Ht.:48-60". Spread: 4'. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Needs good winter protection in Wisconsin. Use in the border garden, cut flower, containers, nectarous plant, butterfly magnet. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Green Value.

BUDDLEIA davidii 'Nahno Purple' (Butterfly Bush)

Lance-shaped, pointed mid-green to gray green foliage; dark red-purple flowers July-October. Ht.: 60+". Spread: 4'. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Needs good

winter protection in Wisconsin. Use in the border garden, cutflower, containers, nectarous plant, butterfly magnet. Zone 5. 4 1/2" Black Pot.

BUDDLEIA davidii 'Pink Delight' (Butterfly Bush)

Lance-shaped, pointed mid-green to gray green foliage; pinkish purple flowers July-October. Ht.: 60+". Spread: 4'. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Needs good winter protection in Wisconsin. Use in the border garden, cutflower, containers, nectarous plant, butterfly magnet. Zone 5. 4 1/2" Black Pot.

CALLICARPA dichotoma 'Issai' (Beautyberry)

A new cultivar from Japan selected for its outstanding compact habit and early fruiting age. Delicate pink flowers in spring give way to beautiful lavender-purple berries produced along the stems in late summer. 'Issai' will perform best in full sun to part shade. Crown hardy to Zone 4, where it reliably grows back each year to 4' and flower and fruit. 3-4' wide with a rounded shape. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

CARYOPTERIS x clandonensis 'Petit Bleu' (Blue Mist Shrub, Bluebeard)

The best Caryopteris we've seen! Tight, compact growth with excellent branching. Dark, green glossy foliage. Deep blue flowers are richer than other Caryopteris varieties, and will attract butterflies to late summer gardens. Enjoy the rare blue color from late summer to fall. Perfect for use in the mixed border or perennial beds. May also be planted as part of a wildlife garden. May die back to the ground each winter so prune in the spring. A Proven Winners' shrub and priced as marked from Bailey's.

CHAENOMELES speciosa 'Texas Scarlet' (Flowering Quince)

Brilliant orange-red flowers bloom in early May before the leaves appear. Lovely in the spring garden for sun to part shade. This is an almost thornless variety. Ht.: 3'. Spread: 3-4' with a mounded habit. Foliage is a shiny green. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

CLETHRA alnifolia 'Ruby Spice' (Summersweet)

A rather new cultivar selected for vastly improved bright pink blooms that do not fade to white. Blooms in midsummer and has a beautiful golden fall color. Clethra is rather shade tolerant, but will also withstand full sun. This is a sport of 'Pink Spires'. Grows upright to 3-6' and spreads to 3-4'. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

CLETHRA alnifolia 'Sixteen Candles' (Summersweet)

SHRUBS (E-4)

A dense rounded shrub with glossy, dark green leaves. Noted for its erect, candle-like flower spikes. The creamy-white blooms are 6" long and extremely fragrant when they bloom in mid-summer. Prefers part-shade and moist soil. Height: 4-5'. Spread: 2-3'. Fall foliage is yellow. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

CORNUS alba 'Ivory Halo' (Redtwig Dogwood)

A Bailey's introduction, this compact selection of variegated dogwood provides beautiful variegated foliage in summer and attractive red twigs in winter. Its finer textured, fuller, more compact form lends itself to smaller planting areas. 5-6' high and wide. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

CORNUS alba 'Kesselringii' (Redtwig Dogwood)

A very hardy, deciduous, shrub which is noted for its brightly colored purple-black stems which make an impressive display in winter. Foliage is green turning purple in autumn. It bears white flowers in spring which are followed by blue fruits. Grows 6-8' tall and 4-5' wide. Priced as marked from Green Value.

CORNUS alba 'Prairie Fire' (Golden Redtwig Dogwood)

A well known, indispensable shrub with colorful bark that provides winter interest. It is not particular about soil type and will grow in sun or semi-shade. Unpruned it will grow to 7 feet tall, but annual pruning will keep it at 5 feet. A workhorse shrub with large bright yellow leaves in spring and bright orange-red stems all through late fall and winter. Its solid gold foliage turns fiery red in the fall. If planted in shade, its foliage will be light green to yellow. An excellent plant for borders or foundations because of its color contrast. Priced as marked from Green Value.

CORNUS sanguinea 'Arctic Sun' (Golden Redtwig Dogwood)

This variety is dwarf in form, reaching a height of 3 to 4 feet. Cornus usually reach a height of 8 to 10 feet, making 'Arctic Sun' a great breakthrough for smaller gardens or residential landscapes. This wonderful shrub will add sensational color in the fall with its golden yellow and peachy orange foliage. It is extremely beautiful in the winter with its yellow stems with red tips. Bring the outdoors in and use 'Arctic Sun' as a cut stem for holiday arrangements or for season long color indoors. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's

COTINUS coggygria 'Golden Spirit' (Smokebush)

This yellow-leaf smokebush will bring a unique hue to the border. New foliage emerges with a touch of red. Smoky yellow flowers appear in June and July, followed by fiery orange-red fall color, changing from the bottom up. Prefers well-drained soil in full sun. 8' tall and 6' wide with a broad upright habit. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

COTINUS coggygria 'Royal Purple' (Smokebush)

Panicles of beige flowers in midsummer. Foliage is a velvety dark purple. Recovers easily from winter injury; getting bushier and more beautiful each year. Grows 8-10' tall and wide. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

SHRUBS (E-5)

COTINUS coggygia 'Young Lady' (Smokebush)

An exciting new smokebush, this unusual shrub is unlike any other smokebush in that it blooms as a young plant and it blooms like crazy. In a container it looks like a poodle in a pot with its frothy blooms covering every inch of the plant. Nearly every shoot forms a flower and it throw flowers from early summer until frost. In the autumn the leaf color turns a superb blend of yellow, orange and red. Height and width are 4-6'. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

COTINUS obovatus 'Cotton Candy', syn. 'Northstar' (Smokebush)

A new cultivar characterized by its cold hardiness in U.S.D.A. Zone 3 or lower, its heavy bloom of pink inflorescences in mid summer, its red and orange fall foliage color, its drought tolerance once established, and its adaptability for growth in poor soils, a wide range of soil pH, and partial sun. Grows to 18' tall. Priced as marked from Green Value.

CYTISSUS nigricans 'Cyni' (Black Broom, Spike Broom)

Bright yellow flowers in June, much later than other varieties. Small green leaves, deciduous. Prune back after blooms keeping compact shape. Likes sun to part shade. Grows 3-4' tall and 3' wide. Tolerates drought and will grow in dry soil, but prefers well-drained/loamy, sandy or clay soils with a pH of acidic to slightly alkaline. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Green Value.

EUONYMUS alatus 'Grove Compact' (Dwarf Burning Bush)

Dwarf, bushy and compact form with corky bark. The wings are very pronounced and eye-catching. Excellent for hedges with brilliant red fall color. 5-6' tall and wide. Summer foliage is medium green. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

EUONYMUS fortunei 'Gold Splash' (Upright Wintercreeper)

Extra large leaves with golden margins. The attractive orange and yellow fruits are very showy and persistent. Very hardy and disease resistant. For sun to shade. Grows to 18-24" tall with an upright habit, unlike the species. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

FALSE SPIREA: See Sorbaria

FORSYTHIA x intermedia 'Fiesta' (Hybrid Forsythia)

This plant really lights up the garden! Incredible variegated foliage of bright yellow and green covers the plant all season long, and the red stems are an added bonus. Golden yellow flowers bloom in the spring. Best in full sun to light shade and evenly mist soils.

SHRUBS (E-6)

Reliably hardy! 3-5' tall and wide with an upright, mounding habit. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

FORSYTHIA x intermedia 'Northern Gold' (Hybrid Forsythia)

From Canada comes this upright shrub with gray-yellow branches and golden yellow flowers. With outstanding flower color and bud hardiness, it produces flowers to the top of the branches even in Canada! 6-8' tall. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's

FORSYTHIA viridissima 'Citrus Sizzle', syn. 'McKCtrine' (Forsythia)

Unlike most forsythias, this variety is grown for its low growing habit and fabulous foliage rather than the flowers; leaves are chartreuse in spring, maturing to green with white variegation. Has creamy white-variegated forest green foliage which emerges chartreuse in spring. The pointy leaves turn an outstanding burgundy in the fall. The flowers are not ornamentally significant. Priced as marked from Green Value.

FOTHERGILLA major 'Blue Shadows'

From Herronswood Nursery: "Gary Handy discovered this dark, blue-green sport from *F. major* 'Mt. Airy'. The foliar color is a backdrop for the typical bottle brush flowers - ivory and strongly perfumed with a sweet essence. In autumn, the foliage turns pleasing shades of orange, yellow and red. No eastern U.S. garden should be without one, especially if you can find a decently moist pocket for it!" Height and width = 3-4'. For full sun. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's and/or Green Value.

FOTHERGILLA major 'Mount Airy'

Noted for its fall color, ranging from yellow through orange and red. Blooms heavily, with white, fragrant flower spikes in April to early May before the leaves appear. Blooms last for up to a month! Summer foliage is a dark, blue-green above and whitish beneath. Ht.: 5-6'. Spread: 4-5' with an upright habit. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

GENISTA tinctoria 'Royal Gold' (Woadwaxen)

Low growing selection with nearly glaucous simple leaves. Flowers are golden yellow, very numerous in July. Grows well in very poor dry soil areas and adds color to the landscape. Just 2' tall and wide. Foliage is bright green. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

GINKGO biloba 'Tshi Tshi' (Dwarf Ginkgo)

Also known as 'Chi-Chi', is a dwarf, dense, mounded, slow-growing, multi-stemmed shrub form of the popular Ginkgo tree. It typically grows to only 4-5' tall with a fan-shaped habit and over 10 years. *Ginkgo biloba* is a deciduous conifer (a true gymnosperm) that features distinctive, two-lobed, somewhat leathery, fan-shaped leaves with diverging (almost parallel) veins. Ginkgo is the only surviving member of a group of ancient plants believed to have inhabited the earth up to 150 million years ago. Leaves turn a uniform golden yellow in autumn. Easily grown in average, medium moisture soil in full sun. Prefers moist, sandy, well-drained soils. Tolerant of a wide

range of soil conditions, including both alkaline and acidic soils and compacted soils. Priced as marked from Green Value.

HAMAMELIS virginiana (Common Witch Hazel)

Flowers have fragrant, yellow, ribbon-like petals, 1 1/2" in diameter and bloom in late fall about the time the leaves drop. Does well in a woodland setting in naturalized situations. In full sun and good soil will develop into a well-rounded vase-shaped plant. Native to the Eastern U.S. Height: 15'. Spread: 12-15'. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HIBISCUS syriacus x 'Bali' (Rose of Sharon)

With its beautiful white blooms, First Editions 'Bali' hibiscus will grant a glimpse of garden paradise July through September. Its semi-double white blossoms are perfectly accentuated by a purple-red center and lush green foliage. Height: 6-8'. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HIBISCUS syriacus x Chiffon Series (Rose of Sharon)

Breathtaking! Large, single flowers adorned with a lacy center to create an anemone-like bloom. H. syriacus does not die back to the ground each year! Prune out only dead wood or prune to shape only after flowering. Easy to grow. Ht.: 8-12' Blooms mid-summer. Plant in rich, well-drained soil in full sun. Zone 5. Available in lavender and white. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HOLLY: See Ilex

HYDRANGEA arborescens 'Annabelle' (Smooth Hydrangea)

Huge white flowers held upright on sturdier stems than the species. This is the impressive white hydrangea one sees as a foundation planting across the country. Habit is low and mounding, growing to 4-5' tall and 5' wide. Tolerates fairly dense shade. Foliage is dark green and not bothered by Japanese beetles. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA arborescens 'Endless Summer-Bella Anna' (Smooth Hydrangea)

A remarkable reblooming magenta-pink Hydrangea Arborescens ('Annabelle'). This hydrangea is a color breakthrough for Hydrangea arborescens and the newest addition to the Endless Summer® Collection. Bella Anna shares the incredible ability to bloom on old and new wood, just like the other hydrangeas in this extraordinary collection it blooms from summer all the way through fall. (Priced as marked from Bailey's)

HYDRANGEA arborescens 'Incrediball' (Smooth Hydrangea)

This adaptable native plant produces huge flowers (12" across) is reliable and beautiful. Very cold hardy Incrediball blooms on new growth so even very cold winters won't keep it from blooming. The flowers are held upright on very sturdy stems, so they won't flop. 4-5' tall. For morning sun to part shade. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Proven Winners.

HYDRANGEA arborescens 'Invincibelle' Spirit (Smooth Hydrangea)

The very first pink mophead! 'Invincibelle' Spirit is as hardy and adaptable as 'Annabelle' but produces loads of hot pink flowers all summer. Proven Winners is donating 5 cents from any purchase toward breast cancer research. 3-4' tall and for morning sun to part shade. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Proven Winners.

HYDRANGEA macrophylla 'Endless Summer-the Original' (Bigleaf, Hortensia, Mophead Hydrangea)

A super-hardy, everblooming mophead! Developed in Minnesota, this variety has serrated, leathery, deep green foliage that turns bronze in the fall. Huge pink (blue in acidic soils by adding aluminum sulfate) blooms appear on both old and new wood for continuous bloom. Deadheading encourages repeat bloom. Grows to just 3-5' tall and wide so it fits perfectly into the perennial bed. For full sun to part shade. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA macrophylla 'Light-O-Day' (Bigleaf Lace-cap, Hortensia)

This is an elegant lacecap with remarkable wide, pure white variegation. The outer ring of the flowers are bright white and the delicate inner blooms are either pink or blue depending on soil pH. Very floriferous! Very eye-catching! Ht.: 3-5'. Spread: 3-5'. For full sun to part shade. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA macrophylla 'Twist-n-Shout' (Bigleaf Lace-cap, Hortensia)

An absolutely extraordinary reblooming lacecap from the Endless Summer collection. Lacy deep-pink centers are surrounded by gorgeous blossoms of pink or periwinkle blue on both old and new wood all summer long, depending on the soil type. Sturdy red stems and glossy, deep green foliage turn red-burgundy in fall. Easy to care for and Zone 4 hardy. Compact enough for containers at just 3-4' tall and wide. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA paniculata 'Pee Gee' (Panicked Hydrangea)

Blooms in July-Aug. Very showy, large, conical, double white flowers change to pink-bronze towards fall. Flowers are useful in dried arrangements. Old-fashioned. Grows to 8' tall. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA paniculata 'Pink Diamond' (Panicked Hydrangea)

Incredibly large flowers open in late summer a cream color, and then, gradually turn a rich shade of pink. Flowers are held upright. Tolerates pruning well and does best in full sun. 6-8' tall and wide. Habit is upright and rounded. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA paniculata 'Tickled Pink' (Panicked Hydrangea)

Tickled Pink's cone-shaped blossoms start out a soft white then gradually turn a rosy pink. The extraordinary blooms are loaded with petals that curve, giving Tickled Pink a lacy, flirty look. Tickled Pink stays more upright and compact than its parent 'Pink Diamond.' Its smaller size means just about any garden can make room for Tickled Pink. It's perfect as a stand-alone plant, as a flower garden backdrop or paired together

in a border. The unique blooms also add a delightful look to fresh or dried flower arrangements. Height: 4-5'. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA paniculata 'Vanilla Strawberry' (Panicked Hydrangea)

This hydrangea paniculata's enormous blooms start out a creamy vanilla-white, changing to a soft pink and finally to a ripe strawberry-red. The unique red color lasts for three to four weeks, longer than most hydrangeas of this variety. New blooms keep the multicolored show going throughout the summer and early fall. The extra large blooms are held on strong, red stems that cascade later in the season. It's upright habit and large cone-shaped flowers make it a dramatic addition to the garden. It is especially showy planted in groups in a border. Grows to 6-7' tall. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

HYDRANGEA quercifolia 'Sike's Dwarf' (Dwarf Oakleaf Hydrangea)

The pretty oakleaf hydrangea, 'Sike's Dwarf', is well-branched, super dwarf selection that bears dome-shaped cones of pure white flowers in summer. In fall its leaves turn attractive russet shades. Large, deep-lobed, oak-like leaves are another attribute that makes this shrub a real standout. 8' tall and broadly pyramidal. Zone 5. A native American shrub. Priced as marked from Bailey's

ILEX verticillata 'Red Sprite' & 'Jim Dandy' (Holly)

Because holly needs both male and female plants to produce berries, Green Value has put both sexes in a single pot, therefore eliminating all of the guesswork. 'Red Sprite' produces bright red fruit in the winter. Flowers are small and numerous. Form is dense and compact at just 3' tall and wide. Grow in sun to part shade. Priced as marked from Green Value.

ITEA virginica 'Henry's Garnet' (Sweetspire)

Shrub valued for its racemes of fragrant white flowers that occur in July, when few other shrubs flower. Prefers moist, rich, fertile soils and will do well in sun or shade. Foliage changes to scarlet and crimson in fall. This shrub has won many awards. Nice in the perennial border at 3-5' tall. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

ITEA virginica 'Little Henry' (Sweetspire)

A new compact Sweetspire perfect for the perennial garden. Pure white flowers in early summer cover this low, mounded, compact shrub. If burning bush has intense fall color, then this plant is wildfire! Ht.: 24-36". Spread: 36". Plant in any good garden soil in sun to shade. Very fragrant and attracts butterflies. A North American native. Zone 5. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

An outstanding introduction. A well-branched shrub with sweet-scented 2", double, white flowers. A great height at just 6-8' with an arching vase shape typical of mockoranges. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

PHILADELPHUS 'Miniature Snowflake' (Dwarf Mockorange)

This compact, prolific bloomer is known for its dwarf habit and excellent flowering. The double white flowers are extremely fragrant. Height: 2-3'. Spread: 1-2' with a dwarf, upright habit. The foliage is deep green and very disease resistant. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

PHYSOCARPUS opulifolius 'Center Glow' (Ninebark)

Much like Diabolo except the red color is far brighter and new foliage emerges a glowing yellow-green. Blooms in the spring with creamy-white flowers. A bold array of colors that lends excitement to the garden all season long. Plant in full sun for best foliage color. 8-10' tall and wide. Upright and rounded. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

PHYSOCARPUS opulifolius 'Diabolo' (Ninebark)

A cultivar from Germany selected for its beautiful red-purple foliage on long arch canes. Forms a rounded mound of foliage, and even though it gets tall, can be controlled by cutting the branches back to the ground each spring. Blooms in the spring with creamy-white flowers that contrasts nicely against the dark foliage. Plant in full sun for best color. PHYSOCARPUS opulifolius 'Summer Wine' (Ninebark)

An exciting new and improved ninebark with neat, compact branching and fine, deeply cut, dark crimson-red leaves. Pinkish-white, button-like flowers appear in mid-summer. Showy and extremely hardy. A wonderful cut flower. Ht.: 5-6'. Spread: 5'. Grow in any good garden soil in full sun. Native to North America. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Green Value.

POTENTILLA fruticosa 'Mango Tango' (Cinquefoil)

This exciting potentilla from the University of Manitoba has striking bicolor flowers that display shades of orange and red radiating from the center of the flower petal over a base color of deep yellow. The red intensifies in cool weather. Hot weather softens the color. Forms a tidy mound and is best in full sun. Wonderful in the mixed perennial border. Ht.: 2'. Spread: 2'. The foliage is a bright green. Zone 2. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

POTENTILLA fruticosa 'Pink Beauty' (Cinquefoil)

SHRUBS (E-11)

This floriferous introduction from the University of Manitoba has clear pink semi-double flowers and bright green foliage that is bushy and full. The flower color holds up very well, but will fade when the nights are very warm. The rounded shape is 2' tall and wide. Full sun. Zone 2. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

PRUNUS x cistena (Purpleleaf Sand Cherry)

The spring flowers are pink and very fragrant. Very hardy and an excellent accent plant. Ht.: 6-8' and 5' wide. Foliage is a rich purple-red. Zone 3. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

PRUNUS glandulosa 'Rosea Plena' (Pink Flowering Almond)

Double pink flowers very early in the spring. Ideal as a small shrub in the mixed flower border. Very valued for its flowering effect when not much else is blooming in the garden. Grows to just 5' tall. Zone 4. Not available in 2011.

RHODODENDRON 'Lights' Azalea Hybrids

Developed at the University of Minnesota for their extreme hardiness (Zone 4), the 'Lights' Series is considered the best rhododendron for Wisconsin gardens. Grow in moist, but well-drained, rich, acidic (pH 4.5-5.5) soil in dappled shade. Azaleas can tolerate neither too much sun, nor dense shade. Though extremely hardy, the 'Lights' Series should still be protected from bitter winter winds. Late frosts will kill flower buds so they may not bloom some years. Roots are very shallow so never plant too deep. And because they are shallow rooted, a loose mulch is advised to preserve moisture, as azaleas are not very drought tolerant. RHODODENDRON 'P.J.M.'

One of the very hardiest azaleas for the upper Midwest. masses of mauve flowers bloom in spring putting on a spectacular show. An evergreen with glossy green foliage throughout the growing season, changing a pleasing purple in the fall. Needs acid, moist, well-drained soil for best performance. 4-5' tall. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Green Value.

RHUS typhina 'Tiger Eyes' (Cutleaf Staghorn Sumac)

This hot, new sumac is stunning in the mixed or prairie border or as a backdrop for all garden beds. Interest is four season! 'Tiger Eyes' is a gorgeous, golden-leafed selection. New growth is chartreuse, quickly changing to yellow, both colors contrasting nicely with the rosy-pink stems. Branches angle upward, while the deeply cut leaflets drape downward, giving it a rather oriental look. Foliage turns a dramatic yellow, orange and intense red in the fall. Grow this native American plant in full sun in any garden soil. Grows to 6' with a 6' spread. Zone 4. Priced as marked from Bailey's.

SHRUBS (E-12)

ROSA (Garden Roses)

The rose is far and away the garden's most beloved shrub, known for its beautiful blooms and astounding fragrance. No other shrub compares in versatility or color selection. Form ranges from shrubs to climbers to groundcovers. Many varieties have been in cultivation for centuries. There are forms native to nearly all parts of the world. Most have thorns and produce fruits in the fall known as "hips", a winter staple for animals and humans alike. Roses can be planted en masse, used as a hedge, incorporated into the perennial border or even used in containers. Roses are divided into categories based primarily on culture and plant and/or flower form. Most roses are grafted on to hardy root stock to improve winter survival. Once home, plant your roses at about the same level you find them in our pots. If planting bare root stock, plant the graft at or just slightly below the soil line. Roses are susceptible to a number of diseases and insect pests--especially fungi and Japanese beetles. When shopping for roses, choose one that is best for the desired situation. Hybrid teas are generally Zone 5 hardy (we sell only hardy roses), but far hardier shrub roses are available. To prep for winter, simply mound soil over the graft and wrap in fabric stuffed with hay. Remove all leaves that have dropped to the ground. We do not advise the use of "rose cones" because they can easily "cook" budded plants in the late winter/early spring sun and can harbor both insect and fungal problems. In early April, remove the fabric and the mounded soil. Prune out any obviously dead or diseased branches, making sure not to cut into healthy tissue.

NOTE: AARS Winner denotes an All-America Rose Selection. Roses in the AARS trials are tested in 24 official test gardens throughout the United States, representing a wide range of climates and growing conditions. They undergo two years of evaluation by rose professionals, and are graded for vigor, growth habit, disease resistance, foliage, flower production, bud and flower form, opening and finishing color, fragrance, stem quality and overall appeal.

HYBRID TEA AND GRANDIFLORA ROSES:

The hybrid teas and grandifloras are the most popular classes of roses. They are tall, stately plants with large blooms of refined form. Most carry their flowers as singles on long stems suitable for cutting. In the landscape, they are often used as single specimens, or as the featured plants in mixed beds of roses. Most are extremely fragrant.

APRIL IN PARIS: 2008 Rose of the Year. Classic seashell buds open into blooms of the palest dawn pink edged in a soft pink. Very long-lasting in the vase. Has an intense tea rose fragrance. Ht.: 5'. Foliage is a glossy, dark green. (J&P 10x10)

AROMATHERAPY: Perfect pink buds and blossoms sweeten the air with a powerful aroma--and an upright, well-branched bush produces them in great numbers. Extremely long-lasting in bouquets. Ht.: 5 1/2'. Semi-glossy, dark-green foliage. Fragrance is strong and fruity. (J&P 10x10)

SHRUBS (E-13)

BELOVED: Flawless, tear-dropped shaped buds spiral open slowly, unfurling to beautifully formed, bright red blossoms on long, sturdy stems. A robust, disease resistant plant with glossy foliage. Formerly named Cesar E. Chavez Rose. Light fragrance. Great for cutting. 5' tall. (J&P 10x10)

BLUE GIRL: Large, double blooms are an extraordinary lavender-lilac color. Light fruity fragrance. Very compact at just 2-3' tall. (Bailey's)

CHRYSLER IMPERIAL: From 1953. This classic has maroon buds, opening to brilliant red blooms. Grows to 3'. Very high petal count. Semi-glossy, dark green foliage. Fragrance is a strong damask. (Bailey's)

FRAGRANT CLOUD: The Rose of the Year Winner in 1968. Known for perfume so luxurious that a single flower can scent a whole room! Clusters of vibrant high-centered coral-red blossoms cover the plant throughout the summer. Plants grow to 3-4' and blossoms measure up to 5" across. Foliage is dark green. (Bailey's)

HONOR: Pure white 4-5" blooms have a light fragrance. Medium height. Petal count is 20-22. Stem length is long with leathery, olive foliage. Opens beautifully in all weather. Ht.: 3-4'. Fragrance is lightly fruity. (Bailey's)

MISS ALL-AMERICAN BEAUTY: Large, long-lasting blossoms are a brilliant pink and beautifully cupped. Exquisite damask fragrance. A 1968 AARS Winner. 3-4' tall. High petal count. (Bailey's)

OLYMPIAD: A 1984 AARS Winner. A superior garden performer produces an abundance of non-fading, brilliant red blooms with classic form on long stems. Very vigorous. Fragrance is light. Blooms measure 5" and have a petal count of 30-35. (Bailey's)

PERFUME DELIGHT: A 1974 AARS Winner. Double blooms in rose-pink with a wonderful damask fragrance. Leathery, dark green foliage sets the stage for a nonstop parade of flowers on 3 foot plants. (Bailey's)

SWEET FRAGRANCE: Hybrid tea-shaped buds in tropical tints of coral and orange with a deep yellow base swirl open to full sweetly fragrant, apricot blossoms. Each bloom matures to salmon-pink, adding interest with the range of color. Clusters of buds and blooms are held on sturdy canes making them perfect for cutting. A vigorous, upright grower at 2-4' tall with excellent disease resistance. Everblooming. (Bailey's)

FLORIBUNDA ROSES:

Floribundas are primarily landscape roses. They are shorter than hybrid teas or grandifloras, and bloom more freely, setting blooms in clusters. Many varieties flower continuously spring through fall. Their low height makes them ideal for borders, or for lining walks or drives. They mix well in beds with hybrid teas, providing a lower front row of color against the taller plants.

SHRUBS (E-14)

CLIMBING ROSES:

These climbers are perennial favorites with customers because there are so many places to use them; against a wall, along a fence, on a post or pillar or over an entryway or arbor. Give them plenty of room and fertilizer.

BLAZE (IMPROVED): One of the most popular climbing roses ever! A reliable, profuse bloomer that guarantees a colorful performance, cascading extravagantly from top to bottom with fiery red blossoms all season. Grows to 10-15'. Light, fruity fragrance. (Bailey's)

JOHN CABOT: This hardy Canadian-bred shrub serves as a small climber or pruned bush. Very fragrant, fuchsia, double flowers bloom in clusters. Grows to 8'. Produces striking orange hips. (J&P 10x10)

SHRUBS (E-15)

Hardy shrub roses have earned the name by being exceptionally tough; withstanding hard freezes, wind and drought. They have recurrent blooms throughout the season and are the most trouble free landscape roses available here in the north.

BUBBLICIOUS: New in 2010. A great rose for beginners, it requires no special treatment, as it shines with clusters of sweet shell pink and white blossoms throughout the entire season. CAREFREE DELIGHT: The Carefree Delight rose is a delightful shrub rose that is very free flowering with vivid pink blooms. It has deep green, glossy leaves with a rich maroon fall color and lots of rose hips in the fall. Carefree Delight roses are one of the most popular and widely grown landscape shrub roses. It has a rugged Minnesota hardiness. AARS winner 1996. 1 1/2" blooms top arching 3' plants. (Bailey's)

CAREFREE SPIRIT: A new low-growing shrub rose that exhibits even better disease resistance, habit and blooming power than its award-winning siblings. Huge clusters of deep, cherry red blooms and healthy dark green glossy foliage. Grows to 5' tall. Fragrance is slight. (J&P 10x10)

CAREFREE SUNSHINE: A compact, mounding, ever-blooming, low-maintenance shrub rose that typically grows to 3-4' tall and as wide and noted for its semi-double yellow flowers, glossy medium green foliage and excellent resistance to black spot. CHAMPLAIN: An attractive shrub that grows on its own root stock to withstand winter dieback during our harsh winters. Has the bloom habit and form of a floribunda, setting bright red flowers that darken at the edges. Just 3' tall with 2 1/2" blooms. The fragrance is sweet. (J&P 10x10)

CORAL COVE: Incredible color, petite size, super disease resistant, what more could you want? This everblooming gem has double blooms whose outer petals are dark pink changing to orange and finally to bright yellow at the center. The small, perfectly rounded form would make it an outstanding informal hedge along a walkway or garden path. The color is so easy to combine it should have a place in every perennial border. SHRUBS (E-16)

SHRUBS (E-17)
